Bill Description

This bill establishes Minnesota Stat. section 116.943, which would prohibit the manufacture, sale, or distribution for sale of select new juvenile products that contain perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances. It does not apply to the sale or resale of used juvenile products or electronic products, medical devices, or adjust mattresses. Under subdivision 3, the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency is also provided enforcement authority under sections 115.071 and 116.072; and may consult with Departments of Commerce and Health. When requested by the commissioner, a person must furnish any information the person may have or may reasonably obtain that is relevant to show compliance with this section. This section is effective January 1, 2025.

Assumptions

Work to prepare for the implementation of this bill will start in July 2024. One FTE will be needed for outreach and education, technical assistance, coordination with other state agencies, random purchasing and sampling of products, and when violations are found, engaging responsible persons for voluntary correction where MN enforcement authority does not exist, and where it does, conducting any necessary enforcement follow-up and complaint response. MPCA will need to purchase some products for testing; due to the breadth of products covered by this bill, the agency anticipates sampling up to 75 products annually. The agency will also need to contract with a laboratory to screen and analyze samples.

Expenditure and/or Revenue Formula

Sample purchases \$100/product x 75 products = \$7,500

Lab tests \$500/sample x 75 tests = \$37,500

1.0 FTE = \$140.000

Long-Term Fiscal Considerations

^{*}The annual cost of 1.0 FTE is \$140,000 in FY2023-2027. Annual costs for 1.0 FTE include salary, fringe, and non-specialized employee support costs (work space, computer and office supplies, office equipment, local travel, etc.)

Bill Description

HF552-0 prohibits the manufacturing, selling, and distributing of juvenile products (products designed or marketed to children under 12 years of age) which contain perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances.

Assumptions

Enforcement of the bill rests with the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA). MPCA may coordinate with Commerce for help with enforcement. Commerce is currently a member of the Chemical Products Interagency Team (CPIT) which coordinates on this type of work with MPCA and the Minnesota Department of Health on this type of consumer protection work. Commerce has an existing, dedicated investigator assigned to CPIT; Commerce assumes that the agency will have no additional costs associated with any coordination work that may result from the passage of this bill.

Bill Description

The bill bans the manufacture, distribution, sale, or offer for sale, or distribute in the state of any new juvenile product that contains perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS), effective January 1, 2025. The ban does not apply to the sale or resale of used juvenile products.

Assumptions

The bill states "The commissioner [of MPCA] may coordinate with the commissioners of commerce and health in enforcing this section." MDH assumes that multiple enforcement cases will be brought per fiscal year, requiring MDH to evaluate products to see if they meet the ban definitions, help with consumer and retailer education on the health risks of PFAS, and assess replacement products. MDH partners with MPCA and commerce on similar initiatives and assumes that certain activities, such as the development of education materials and notifications to retailers, will take place the year before the effective date of implementation on January 1, 2025.
