### **Bill Description**

This bill amends 626.8469 to create standards and minimum hours associated with crisis intervention and mental illness crisis training.

Subd. 1a. requires that the board, in consultation with the commissioner of human services and mental health stakeholders, shall create a list of approved entities and training courses to instruct peace officers in techniques for responding to a mental illness crisis. Further, this section identifies specific scenario-based instruction and issues that must be covered by the course.

Subd. 2. states that the head of every local and state law enforcement agency shall maintain written records of the agency's compliance with the requirements of subdivisions 1 and 1a and include:

- 1. documentation of the training provider;
- 2. documentation of the content of the training provided;
- 3. documentation that crisis intervention and mental illness crisis training included scenario-based instruction in compliance with the standards described in subdivision 1a;
- 4. compiled evaluations; and
- 5. explanation of expenditure of funds.

This section requires that this data be included in the annual compliance reviews required per 626.8469 and an evaluation of the effectiveness of in-service crisis intervention and mental illness crisis training in reducing officer use of force and diverting people experiencing a mental illness crisis from arrest.

Section 2 of the bill appropriates money from the general fund in fiscal 2021 to the Peace Officers Standards and Training Board for reimbursement to agencies for compliance with the mandates in this bill.

Section 3 requires the Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) Board to administer a pilot project to create collaborations between county mobile crisis mental health services described in section 245.469 and municipal law enforcement agencies. The appropriation shall be used to purchase tablets and video conferencing telehealth services to allow peace officers to connect quickly with members of the mobile crisis mental health team to assist individuals in crisis. No later than September 1, 2021, law enforcement agencies awarded grants shall provide a written report to the board describing the expenditure of funds and evaluating the effectiveness of the project in diverting people experiencing a mental illness crisis from arrest. The board shall submit a written report compiling the law enforcement agency reports and evaluating the program to the chairs and ranking minority members of the house of representatives and senate committees with jurisdiction over public safety by January 1, 2022 and appropriates funds for fiscal 2021 for this purpose.

#### **Assumptions**

Assumes that existing POST staff will require approximately 160 hours to work with the commissioner of human services and mental health stakeholders to review course materials and create a list of approved training providers.

Assumes that the POST Board will have to add an FTE with a research and mental health/crisis intervention background (the POST Board does not currently possess this staff expertise) to conduct research, consult with subject matter experts and convene ad hoc teams to properly evaluate course effectiveness in reducing use of force and diversion of persons in mental health crisis from arrest. Additionally, this FTE will be tasked with overseeing, administering the program required under section three as well as evaluating the effectiveness of the program for reporting to the house of representatives.

Assumes that the training identified in the bill simply prescribes the number of hours (4) that must make up the crisis intervention/mental health portion of the already mandated 16 hours of peace officer training and that no additional appropriation beyond the 6 million dollars already appropriated for FY2021 is required.

Assumes that the training reimbursement will come from the 2.9 million dollar base appropriated to local law enforcement agencies annually and the additional 6 million dollar training appropriation that is approved for FY2021.

Assumes the pilot program will be initiated with three law enforcement agencies requiring three tablets, three licenses for video conferencing, middleware and/or VPN access, plus a 5% contingency for unknown costs associated with the pilot project.

Assumes that POST is purchasing 3 tablets on behalf of the Department of Human Services (DHS) for each local crisis unit assigned to each law enforcement agency in the pilot program, for a total of 9 additional tablets.

#### **Expenditure and/or Revenue Formula**

Course material review, implementation, approval of providers: One professional position: 160 hours @ \$57 (including fringe) = \$9,000.

One professional position: 2080 hours, \$121,000 including fringe. Costs for additional rent, furniture, computer and software, miscellaneous = approximately \$16,000.

3 agencies @ 1 tablet @ \$1000 apiece, 3 crisis units @ 3 tablets @ \$1000 apiece (12 total) = \$12,000.00; Annual software license/access for teleconference @ \$30.00 X 12 tablets = \$360.00; Middleware/VPN access @ \$30.00 X 12 = \$360.00; plus a 5% estimated cost of administering the program = \$636.00. Total for pilot = \$13,356.00

#### **Long-Term Fiscal Considerations**

As the bill requires ongoing annual analysis under 626.8469 which will require an overall base increase in subsequent budget years.

Upon the currently scheduled sunset of the 6 million dollars of training funds in FY2022, reimbursements to law enforcement agencies will be reduced beginning in FY2022. Reimbursement for this training will come from the base appropriation of 2.9 million dollars per fiscal year.

#### **Local Fiscal Impact**

The fiscal impact to local government units, specifically the 422 current state, county and local law enforcement agencies is hard to predict given their unique staffing, budgetary resources and individual ability to report data.

### **Bill Description**

House File 4192-0 enhances training requirements in crisis intervention and mental illness crisis management. It also adds a mandatory reporting requirement that documents the training completed and an assessment of the effectiveness in reducing officer use of force in diverting people with mental illness.

#### **Assumptions**

The bill requires Commerce Fraud Bureau (CFB) POST certified Peace Officers to complete this training annually. The CFB is required to complete reporting requirements as designated by the POST Board. Commerce assumes current administrative resources are sufficient to meet the proposed enhanced reporting requirement.

Commerce assumes the total hours of training for Peace Officers would not change, but that the training requirements related to crisis intervention and mental illness crisis training will be modified.

### **Bill Description**

The proposed legislation would establish standards for crisis intervention and mental illness crisis training for peace officers. A minimum of four hours of training would be required within an officer's three-year licensing cycle.

Section 2 would provide for reimbursement of training expenses to law enforcement agencies by the Peace Officers Standards and Training (POST) Board.

#### **Assumptions**

The Department of Corrections (DOC) currently employees 13 licensed peace officers.

It is assumed the total hours of training required for peace officers would not change, but that the training requirements related to crisis intervention and mental illness crisis training would be modified.

Section 2 of this bill provides for reimbursement of training expenses by the POST Board.

The recordkeeping requirements would be performed within existing responsibilities.

There are no criminal charges in this bill.

There would be no impact on prison beds or supervision caseloads.

The fiscal impact to the DOC as a result of the provisions of this bill would be minimal.

An effective date is not specified.

### **Bill Description**

HF4192-0 adds additional standards related to crisis intervention and mental illness crisis continuing education training received by law enforcement officers during their 3 year licensing cycle. The POST Board is charged with establishing a list of qualified entities and curricula that law enforcement agencies may use to deliver the training. The Department of Human Services is to assist the POST board in a consultative role in establishing this list of qualified entities and curricula. Sec. 2 of the bill establishes an unspecified appropriation to the POST board to reimburse law enforcement agencies for the cost of this training.

Sec 3 of the bill establishes an unspecified appropriation to the POST board administer a pilot project to create collaborations between county mobile crisis mental health services supervised by the Department of Human Services.

#### **Assumptions**

This fiscal note assumes that the Behavioral Health Division within the Department of Human Services will serve in a consultative role with the POST board for the development and maintenance of law enforcement crisis intervention and mental illness crisis continuing education. We also assume that we'll have a consultative role in planning the collaboration pilot. We assume that this consultation can be accomplished within currently available resources.

We assume that any technical resources required to implement this bill, including mobile devices to implement the pilot project, will not be supplied by the Department of Human Services.

### **Bill Description**

The bill provides a new level of detail for training standards for crisis intervention and mental illness training for law enforcement, to support reduced officer use of force and arrests of persons experiencing a mental illness crisis. Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) Board would provide approved designated entities to provide the qualifying training. The training must include scenario based instruction. The training would need to be completed each three-year POST licensing cycle.

#### **Assumptions**

DNR Enforcement currently has training in place for the training required under the statute. This legislation would require an enhancement of that training program but does not increase the amount of training hours. That current training is provided through a contract vendor (POST approved) via an online video delivery platform. Our training plan, moving forward under this legislation, will continue to augment the online base training by implementing scenarios during inservice training that includes the enhanced training topics.

This bill adds a requirement within the broader training standards but does not increase the amount of training needed. We therefore assume that this bill will not increase our training costs relative to our current expenditures.

#### **Expenditure and/or Revenue Formula**

This bill does not increase expenditures relative to our current training budget therefore there are no new costs as a result of this bill.

### **Bill Description**

HF4192-0 establishes standards for crisis intervention and mental illness crisis training for peace officers. A minimum of four hours of training would be required within an officer's three-year licensing cycle. The bill appropriates money to the Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) Board to reimburse law enforcement agencies for crisis intervention and mental illness training expenses for training provided by approved entities.

#### **Assumptions**

The hours of training required for peace officers does not change. Any crisis intervention and mental illness training expenses for training provided by approved entities would be reimbursed by the Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) Board.
